Claudette Johnson was born in Manchester in 1959, and now lives and works in London.

She makes very large artworks that show black women in Britain, using bold lines and colours to create expressive figure drawings.

A figure drawing is a drawing of a live model posing for the artist but can also be from photographs or the artist's imagination.

Claudette uses different materials to create the beautiful textures in her artworks including pastels and paint.

ABOUT THE ART WORKS.

Claudette draws her figures of black women larger than life, so that they take up all of the space on the paper in their own way.

When she's drawing, She uses her whole body stretching to create the marks and lines across the paper.
