Claudette Johnson: I Came to Dance

One of the most arresting figurative artists working in Britain today. Claudette Johnson creates larger than life studies that are both intimate and powerful. I Came to Dance is Johnson's first solo show at a major institution in almost three decades and includes paintings and drawings in pastel, paint, ink and charcoal.

Throughout her career, Johnson has continually questioned the boundaries imposed upon black women, asking her sitters to "take up space in a way that is reflective of who they are." Often drawn from life and centred on a single figure, the fluid lines and compelling sensitivity of Johnson's works have attracted critical acclaim. This is a rare opportunity to see a significant body of her work.

"I do believe that the fiction of 'blackness', that is the legacy of colonialism, can be interrupted by the encounter with the stories that we tell about ourselves." - Claudette Johnson


